Subject: PROCESS FOR DETERMINING ACADEMIC DISTINCTION

Persons Concerned: High School Principals, Vice Principals, Counselors, and Registrars

Reference: This Site Operations Circular Replaces Administrative Procedure 4772

DUE DATES: End of semester 1/Q2 or last progress report prior to end of second semester

Action Requested: Review guidelines and implement

Brief Explanation:

Students are only eligible for the diploma with academic distinction if they meet the following criteria:

- attended one or more San Diego Unified School District high schools their entire high school career
- attended one full year at a district high school
- met one of the criteria delineated in method 1 or 2 (below)
- met all graduation requirements as referenced in Administrative Procedure 4770.

Other students who may qualify for this recognition include:

- Students who have attended high schools in other districts for all or part of grades 9-11 if their academic performance in the San Diego Unified School District merits consideration
- Current class of SDUSD mid-year graduates who meet all of the eligibility criteria
- Future class of students (i.e. c/o 2020) who plan to graduate early, who have attended the entire school year of their final year of high school in one of SDUSD schools, and have met all graduation requirements.

Effective with the Class of 2017, the following two methods are available for graduation with academic distinction:

- Method 1: The student must maintain a weighted grade point average of 3.5 (B+) or higher for all courses taken in grades 10 and 11 and the first semester of grade 12.
 - (1) Students who raise their cumulative grade-point average to 3.5 by the end of the last reporting period prior to the end of second semester/Q4 during their senior year are also eligible to receive this diploma.

NOTE: Due to commencement program timelines, students who do not meet the required WGPA by first semester may not be included as receiving this recognition in the commencement program. Sites must notify students and families.

Method 2: Student must complete 14 semester credits in grades 9-12 with grades of an "A" or "B" in courses that are Advanced, Advanced Placement, Honors, International Baccalaureate and/or dual credit college courses. Two of the 14 courses must be completed during the first semester of grade 12 and the student must be enrolled in

two of the listed courses during second semester of grade 12 (and earn an "A" or "B" on the last progress report prior to the end of semester 2). Designated courses are shown in Section D.4.

- (1) Students who raise their grade to an "A" or "B" in one or more higher level course(s) by the last reporting period prior to the end of second semester/Q4 are also eligible to receive this diploma. This applies to the two courses that require enrollment during the second semester of their senior year.
- (2) Credit(s) received prior to grade 9 in world languages and advanced math, if the course(s) are awarded graduation credit, may be counted toward meeting this requirement.

IMPLEMENTATION

- High school principals have the authority to issue diplomas with academic distinction to students meeting the criteria as noted above.
- After the end of semester 1/Q2, high school counselors and registrars verify weighted grade point average (WGPA) of all seniors to determine who qualifies for this recognition. Students who qualify for a diploma with academic distinction under method 1 are included in the site's commencement program as receiving this recognition.
- High school counselors and registrars conduct evaluations of credits (for method 2) or WGPAs after the final progress report prior to the end of second semester/Q4 to determine which students are eligible for a diploma with academic distinction. Dependent on commencement program timelines, students who are eligible during method 2 timeframe may not be included in the commencement program. Sites must communicate the student status to students and families.
- High school registrars ensure that their site Grad Doc is updated with a "Diploma with Academic Distinction" designation (under Graduation Document) for students who will be awarded a diploma with academic distinction. This will ensure students' final transcript reflects this diploma type.
- Effective with class of 2019, the following is the Method 2 designated course list (grades 9-12), that includes courses that have been removed and no longer meet this requirement.

Note: additional courses that qualify under method 2 are listed in the updated college course list included in Site Operations Circular No. 2021: *Student Enrollment in College/University Coursework*.
